# **For CACJ's Consideration**

- The acknowledgement of the International Framework for Court Excellence (IFCE) as a self-assessment tool that the ASEAN Judiciaries can voluntarily adopt to identify areas of strength and areas for improvement, in order to improve court administration and the delivery of justice.
- The agreement for a colloquium on the latest edition of the IFCE to be conducted on the side-lines of the 8<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the CACJ in 2020, and for each ASEAN Judiciary to send representatives to the colloquium.
- The agreement to authorise Singapore to work with the International Consortium for Court Excellence to organise the colloquium in 2020 and to update the ASEAN Judiciaries on the progress.
